

The 2022 New Girls' Orientation began on Saturday, 15th January, 2022 to Friday, 28th January, 2022 at the School's Auditorium. The various presentations from the leadership of the school focused on:

LEGACY GIRLS' COLLEGE

As new students, it was prudent for them to know a bit about the new environment they have found themselves in. Thus, they were taken through the school's handbook, which spells the rules and regulations and appropriate sanctions that go with flouting any rule. Students were also taken through the history of the school, the mission and vision, and the core values that students should live by among others. This session ended with the girls taking a tour of the school campus.

SELF- DEVELOPMENT

The essence of this session was to equip the girls to consciously pursue personal growth by improving personal skills, competencies, talents and knowledge in order to seek self-fulfilment

and proactively reach their full potential. In view of that, a seminar was held on personal grooming. The girls were also exposed to the concept of Self-Awareness, Self-Esteem and a comprehensive education on Morality and Sexuality.

ACADEMICS AND PARACADEMICS
