Health Walk

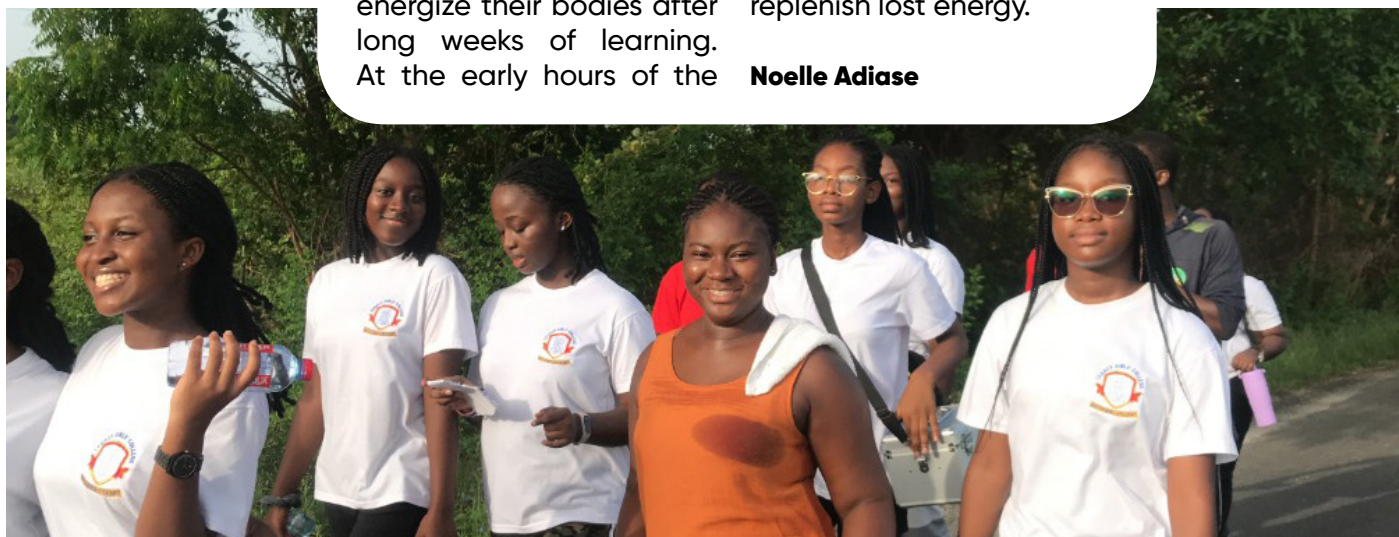
